Since 1997 has trained over 15 000 professionals from Romania, Moldova, Serbia, Ukraine, Russia, Bulgaria, Greece, Macedonia, Armenia, Kosovo, Albania, Uzbekistan, Tajikistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Czech Republic, Georgia, Hungary, Poland, Germany.

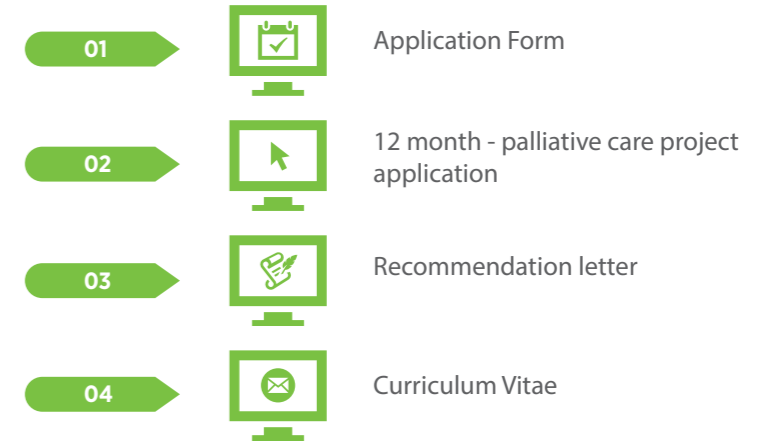
Before applying, make sure you meet **ALL** of the following **prerequisites**:

- 02 You have graduated a formal course in palliative care (i.e.: ELNEC, HOSPICE Casa Speranței, St.Christopher's multi-professional week etc.)
- 03 You are currently in a leadership position
- 04 You speak and write English
- 05 Able to participate in monthly Skype conferences from October 2014 to September 2015
- 06 Committed to attend the entire residential course (22 - 28 Sept 2014)
- 07 Develop a 12 months palliative care project
- 08 Committed to complete 2 after-course evaluations (at 6 and 12 months)
